'David Copperfield' is the first book by Charles Dickens that I've ever read, and it will probably be my last! First published in 1850, it's a huge book more than 700 pages. However, the story is very simple and straight-forward. It tells us about the life of a poor country boy called David Copperfield, from his early childhood until early middle age.

His early years are very difficult. After his father dies, his mother marries again and David is mistreated by new stepfather. He manages to make some friends at school. However, then his mother suddenly dies, and he is left completely in the control of his stepfather. He is taken out of school and sent to earn money in a factory in London, where he is miserable. He runs away to his aunt's house where things improve and he completes his schooling and starts work. However, when his aunt loses all her money, he has to face more difficulties. But in the end he achieves everything he has ever wanted.

I don't know what to think of this book. I found the first two hundred pages very boring. David Copperfield is actually the novel's least interesting character, and this part of the book deals almost entirely with him! In fact, the book doesn't really come alive until almost the middle of the story when David's aunt loses all her money. After that, David and his friends really start trying to repair the mistakes they have made in their lives.

The book's hero' is, in my opinion, too serious and too moralistic. I managed to find some humorous parts - always my favourite thing in any book! - but not many, and the last part of the book is very strange. In the last 200 pages, Dickens really speeds up the action, and it's an odd feeling when a slow book suddenly starts moving quickly just before the end. So, very suddenly, Dickens kills one important character, exports several people to Australia, and sends two more to prison!

So, as I've said, I didn't actually like David Copperfield (the hero I mean), and I wouldn't have liked the book either, if not for the wonderful secondary characters. There is Agnes, David's good and wise childhood friend; the always in-debt Micawbers; the evil Uriah Heep; the sentimental, kind Mr Peggotty; and so many other people to keep track of ... but all good fun anyway!
